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

- Sign a contract agreeing to remain crime and drug free, attend school regularly, maintain a 2.5 GPA, and meet with a mentor once a week

The applicant's 2023—2024 academic records will be reviewed prior to application approval. Please review the financial qualifications below:

2023 Federal Income Tax Return filed by parent(s) or guardian(s) claiming student as a dependent is required to verify income eligibility.



## CFKA (MCSD) STUDENT LUNCH ACCOUNT- LUNCHES PROVIDED BY GAE - CREATE AN ACCOUNT. SET UP PAYMENTS +ALERTS



The Food Service Department allows children to charge meals as a courtesy. In general, meals are to be paid for daily, or by using the prepay account which allows you to pay ahead.

Please send a payment to the cafeteria to add money to your child's account. You may send cash or check. Checks should be made payable to MCSD-Food Service. You can also go online to

https://www.mypaymentsplus.com/ and set up an account for your child that allows you to monitor their cafeteria purchases, account balances and for a small fee deposit money into their accounts. Please note: your child's ID # may have changed, if the ID # does not work, please contact your child's school to get the correct #. The ID # begins with 44000xxxxx, it is not the 5 digit PIN.

Students with negative balances of any amount will not be allowed to purchase a la carte items. Also, these balances will continue to roll from year to year until they are paid.
